- Canada motor vehicle transportation laws related to securing loads and vehicle weights and dimensions fall within the exclusive jurisdiction of provinces and territories.
- Transport Canada sets rules and regulations relating to the safe operation of federally-regulated (extra-provincial) motor carriers and commercial vehicle drivers (Motor Vehicle Transport Act, RSC 1986 c29). However, there is nothing applicable to the regulation of unsecured loads, maximum gross vehicle weights, and/or maximum vehicle heights.
